2010-11 School Immunization Requirements

The Indiana State Department of Health has made the following changes to the school immunization requirements for school year **2010-2011** are as follows:

- * All preschool and kindergarten students will be required to have 2 doses of varicella vaccine, given on or after the first birthday and separated by 3 months.
 - * All kindergarten students will be required to have one of the required doses of polio vaccine given on or after the fourth birthday, and at least 6 months after the previous dose.
 - * All 6th – 12th grade students will be required to have 2 doses of varicella vaccine, given on or after the first birthday, and separated by age-appropriate intervals as defined by the CDC.
 - * All 6th -12th grade students will be required to have 1 dose of tetanus-diphtheria-acellular pertussis vaccine given on or after the 10th birthday.
 - * All 6th-12th grade students will be required to have 1 dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine.
- Did you know that every school nurse enters 20-25 immunization dates for *each student in their school* (@630 students at IC) in the Lawrence Township computer system? Also, if a parent has given permission to enter this same information in to the CHIRP system, your school nurse chooses from **118** combinations of vaccines on that list when she enters the vaccine dates. This is only a small part of the record keeping each school nurse does for every student in their school.

AHERA ANNUAL NOTICE
M.S.D. of LAWRENCE TOWNSHIP

This information is being published to comply with the requirements of 40 CFR 763 Subpart E Asbestos Containing Materials in Schools. This regulation, commonly known as the "AHERA" rule, requires local education agencies, such as this one, to perform certain tasks in regards to the presence and control of asbestos containing materials in the buildings under the jurisdiction of the local education agency.

These include but are not limited to:

1. Developing an asbestos management plan which is designed to outline procedures and guidelines for the inspection, reinspection and periodic surveillance of asbestos containing materials that are present in the buildings.
2. Provide awareness training and additional training to selected school employees.
3. Periodically notify all workers and occupants, or their local guardians, parent teacher organizations, and collective bargaining organizations of the availability of asbestos management plans, the location of same and the times that the plans may be reviewed.

This notification is to advise all patrons, occupants, or their legal guardians, collective bargaining organizations, and parent-teachers organizations, that the asbestos management plans required under this act are available for review upon request. A copy of the plans for all buildings under the jurisdiction of this local education agency are available in the Operations Building, which is located at 8301 East 46th Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46226; telephone number (317) 545-2823. Plans for individual schools and other buildings are located in the administration office of each building. The plans can be viewed by any person during normal business hours of the particular school. Interested parties wishing to inquire about the hours and times that the plans are available should call the above number.

At this time, the management plans can provide information regarding inspections, response actions, and post-response action activities, including periodic reinspection and surveillance activities that are planned or in progress. Inquiries regarding any facet of the regulation or the management plans should be directed to Mr. Rodger Smith at the above telephone number during regular business hours.

Listed is a brief description of asbestos work that has been completed in our schools this year. Detailed reports have become part of each school's asbestos management plan and may be reviewed in the school office.

Lawrence North High School, Belzer and Craig Middle Schools, Mary Evelyn Castle, Crestview, Harrison Hill, Indian Creek, and Skiles Test Elementary Schools, Operations/Maintenance Building and Lawrence Township School Foundation

* The required triennial reinspection will be performed in September 2012.

* The required six month periodic surveillance was performed in September 2009.

* The next scheduled activity will be the required six month periodic surveillance in March 2010.

Lawrence Central High School, Fall Creek Valley Middle School, Amy Beverland, Brook Park, Forest Glen, Oaklandon, Sunnyside Elementary, and Winding Ridge Elementary Schools, Administration Building, Transportation Building, McKenzie Career Center and the Early Learning Centers

These buildings contain no asbestos material and require no further response action under AHERA.
